

Role playing giving invites for evangelism group or personal work activities for growth.

Benefits, it helps synchronize their actions to more easily to such invites in real life. And get them into the pattern and behavior of actively doing this work. This helps get them more comfortable with giving invites.

This can be fun and enjoyable to do and to help build habits of giving invites. These role-playing exercises should be done in each evangelism class. Each student should do two role playing exercises of giving invites. They should practice on each other. These exercises can also be done with one's family or friends within the faith for personal development as well as on oneself. We will outline different scenarios where you can role play this exercise.

It's best to ask a question, to get a conversation going, then ask their name and introduce oneself, then when talking to conclude the conversation with giving invite. Just like you do for networking or asking someone out on a date.

The more you practice doing this in role playing the easier it gets. Asking questions, talking and interactions will get easier. Have your partner play along and engage in conversation and be responsive to the questions you ask. The more you practice the better you will get.
