Mormons say they have new revelation. They say the Bible is imperfect. But the Book of Mormon and the other books they carry are flawless and divine.

In saying this they accept the "angel" Moroni's teachings. For Joseph Smith the founder of Mormonism, said he got new revelation from this being.

What does the Bible say? Galatians 1:8 "But even if we or an angel from heaven should preach a gospel contrary to the one we preached to you, let him be under a divine curse! 9 As we have said before, so now I say again: If anyone is preaching to you a gospel contrary to the one you embraced, let him be under a divine curse!"

How can they even know if such was of God, clearly if it was an angel it was not, for the Bible warns of accepting any other revelation then that which has already been given.

Even...as the Bible warns in 2 Corinthians 11:14 "And no wonder, for Satan himself masquerades as an angel of light."

No other faith (or teaching is needed). The truth was once for all delivered for the saints.

Jude 3 "Dear friends, although I was very eager to write to you about the salvation we share, I felt compelled to write and urge you to contend for the faith that was once for all entrusted to God's holy people."

This faith/truth that God has give us is in the knowledge Christ gave us in His Word. Such knowledge gives us everything we need for godliness and life. 2 Peter 1:3 "His divine power has given us everything we need for a godly life through our knowledge of him who called us by his own glory and goodness."

ALL scripture written before the book of Mormon was inspired and was able equip us for all God's divine work and service.

2 Tim 3:16 "All Scripture is God-breathed and is useful for teaching, rebuking, correcting and training in righteousness, 17 so that the servant of God may be thoroughly equipped for every good work."

We are not to add to the Words of God's prophecy.

Revelation 22:19 "and if anyone takes away from the words of the book of this prophecy, God will take away his part from the tree of life and from the holy city, which are written in this book."

God's Word has been tried and tested and remains pure. This is what God has said. To say otherwise is to make the Almighty incompetent and His Word a lie. Psalm 12:6 "The words of the LORD are pure words; As silver tried in a furnace on the earth, refined seven times."

God speaks in His Word and says He does not err or make mistakes. That is message can not be changed or damaged. And due to this, to not add to them... *Proverbs 30:5 "Every word of God is tested; He is a shield to those who take refuge in Him. 6 Do not add to His words Or He will reprove you, and you will be proved a liar."*

Their books even say that God's Word, can not change. THE SON OF ALMA CHAPTER 41: 8 "Now, the decrees of God are unalterable; therefore, the way is prepared that whosoever will may walk therein and be saved." Yet the Mormon faith says the Bible has been changed. They say the writings contradict.

According to the Book of Mormon, about 600 years before Christ, a Nephite prophet predicted that "many plain and precious parts" (1 Nephi 13:26-28) would be removed from the Bible. In contrast, from the Bible it is clear that during His earthly ministry, Jesus himself constantly quoted from the Old Testament Scriptures, and showed full confidence in their completeness and accurate transmission as they had survived down to His time. Jesus declared that "heaven and earth shall pass away, but my word shall not pass away" (Mark 13:31.) (1)

The Mormon writings contradict in the matter of Polygamy.

Their teachings say such behavior is called an abomination in reference to King David, *Jacob 2:24 Jacob declares*, "Behold, David and Solomon truly had many wives and concubines, which thing was abominable before me, saith the Lord" (See other condemning verses in Jacob 1:15;2:27/Mosiah 11:2/Ether 10:5)

Yet if polygamy is wicked then such actions would have made Jesus a sinner, for they say He was a Polygamist.

The Seer vol 1 p 158-159 "One thing is certain, that there were several holy women that greatly. Such as Mary, and Martha her sister, and Mary Magdalene; and Jesus greatly loved them, and associated with them much; and when He arose from the dead, instead of first showing Himself to His chosen witnesses, the Apostles, He appeared first to these women, or at least to one of them namely, Mary Magdalene. Now, it would be very natural for a husband in the resurrection to appear first to his own dear wives, and afterwards show himself to his other friends. If all the acts of Jesus were written, we no doubt should learn that these beloved women were his wives."

Polygamy is even commanded to be obeyed as part of the law or damnation will follow. Doctrines and Covenants 132:1,3,4,61,62

(Joseph Smith is recorded to have had up to 30 wives, many whom were married to other men. The Founding Father, believed in this practice. https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Origin_of_Latter_Day_Saint_polygamy)

Which is it? Is God confused? Does He contradict Himself?

But if these writings were from just man's own interpretation and inclining, then the flaws would make more sense. What do the Mormon writings say? Are they perfect? The Bible says it is flawless for it is of God and God does not make mistakes. (Proverbs 30:5-6)

Yet the Mormon writings say otherwise. They say they are not flawless.

1 Nephi 1:3 "And I know that the record which I make is true; and I make it with mine own hand; and I make it according to my knowledge."

1 Nephi 19:6 "Nevertheless, I do not write anything upon plates save it be that I think it be sacred. And now, if I do err, even did they err of old; not that I would excuse myself because of other men, but because of the weakness which is in me, according to the flesh, I would excuse myself."

Jacob 7:26 "And it came to pass that I, Jacob, began to be old; and the record of this people being kept on the other plates of Nephi, wherefore, I conclude this record, declaring that <u>I have written according to the best of my knowledge</u>, by saying that the time passed away with us...."

Mormon 8:12 And whoso receiveth this record, and shall not condemn it because of the <u>imperfections</u> which are in it, the same shall know of greater things than these. Behold, I am Moroni; and were it possible, I would make all things known unto you. (2)
